All MCAH programs serve pregnant and parenting families living in San Joaquin County. All programs provide pregnancy and parenting support, general health education, case management, screenings, community referrals, advocacy, and ensure families are connected to medical, dental, mental-health, developmental, and social resources within the community, based on the family's needs.

~ Nurse Home Visiting ~

- Public health nurses are beneficial to medically high-risk mothers, infants, and children
- Appointments with the nurse are approximately every 4 weeks or as needed
- Eligibility Criteria: Pregnant or those with a baby under age 1, or a child with special healthcare needs under age 5

~ Black Infant Health ~

- The program addresses racial disparities in birth outcomes by empowering and supporting African American women to have healthy pregnancies, healthy babies, and be healthy moms
- There are 10 prenatal and 10 postpartum group sessions and monthly workshops
- Participants also have individual appointments with a nurse, a mental health professional, and a family health advocate
- Eligibility Criteria: Pregnant African American women age 16 or older, who are pregnant or have given birth in the last 6 months

~ Healthy Families San Joaquin ~

- This evidence-based program focuses on strengthening parent-child relationships and interactions. The program is beneficial to families with social risk factors or child welfare involvement
- Appointments with a Family Support Specialist begin weekly, and decrease to bi-monthly, monthly, then quarterly
- Eligibility Criteria: Pregnant or those who have a newborn less than 2 weeks old

~ Safe Sleep San Joaquin ~

- Families who do not have a safe sleep environment for their infant will receive a free portable crib after receiving safe sleep education from a Public Health Nurse **(as supplies last)**
- Eligibility Criteria: Participant must be pregnant or have a baby less than 6 months old. Please specify in the comments if your family urgently needs a safe sleeping environment
