Peer-to-Peer Discussions



A treating provider can request within **five**(5) business days of receiving the denial notification



To request a peer-to-peer for a prior authorization denial:

Call 209-942-6353



Should only be sought upon request of the physician that is involved and familiar with the member's care



Requestor must attest/confirm they are familiar with the case and either:

- Have specific questions about the criteria used to make the decision, OR
- Have new information about the case that may lead to a change in decision



To request a peer-to-peer for an inpatient stay denial:

- Call the Health Plan Inpatient CCRN assigned to your facility, OR
- Call 209-942-6353



Reminder: submit clinical documentation to support inpatient admission and/or continued stay

What Is Medicare?

- Medicare is a health insurance program that helps people pay for their health care.
- It is paid for by the federal government.
- It started in 1965.
- Medicare is run by a group called the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).



Who Can Get Medicare?

- People who are 65 or older and can get Social Security (or their husband or wife does, even if they have passed away)
- People under 65 who have a disability and get Social Security disability benefits
- Most people must wait 2 years after getting disability benefits before they can get Medicare



What is Health Plan San Joaquin/Mountain Valley Health Plan Advantage D-SNP?

Health Plan San Joaquin/Mountain Valley Health Plan Advantage D-SNP is a type of MA plan (Part C), called a D-SNP (or Medi-Medi plan)

Health Plan San Joaquin/Mountain Valley Health Plan Advantage D-SNP covers:

- Covers each benefit in Part A (hospital care) and Part B (doctor visits and outpatient care)
- Also covers extra benefits like vision, hearing, and health programs
- Comes with drug coverage (Part D)
- Helps pay the cost share that Medicare doesn't cover

D-SNP plans (like Health Plan of San Joaquin/Mountain Valley Health Plan Advantage D-SNP) **always** cover drug coverage

When Does HPSJ/MVHP D-SNP Begin?

- HPSJ/MVHP will offer a D-SNP effective January 1, 2026.
- Enrollments can begin October 2025 for a 01/01/2026 effective date.



When Can Someone Enroll In Our D-SNP?

Annual Enrollment Period (AEP)

October 15 through December 7 of each year

Special Enrollment Period (SEP)

Dual-eligible members can join our D-SNP any month of the year

Model of Care (MOC) Training Announcement

Health Plan of San Joaquin/Mountain Valley Health Plan Advantage (HMO D-SNP), as a licensed Dual Eligible Special Needs Plan (D-SNP), is required by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to ensure all network providers complete annual **Model of Care (MOC)** training.

Who Must Complete the Training?

This requirement applies to all network providers who deliver care to D-SNP members or are responsible for managing D-SNP health care benefits.

Training Deadline

The training must be completed by **December 31, 2025**

Why It's Important

Completing MOC training ensures:

- You are eligible to treat D-SNP members effective January 1, 2026.
- You are CMS compliant



Model of Care (MOC) Training - Continued

Training Objectives

By the end of this training, network providers will be able to:

- 1. Provide an overview of the MOC structure to network and out-of-network providers who see D-SNP members on a routine basis.
- 2. Understand Care Management goals for members of the provider network.
- Identify key roles and departments that support the implementation and delivery of MOC at HPSJ/MVHP.
- 4. Understand the role of the Interdisciplinary Care Team, in coordinating care for HPSJ/MVHP Special Needs Plan members.

Steps to Complete the Training:

- 1. Visit the HPSJ/MVHP provider training page
- 2. Click on the "MOC Training" button
- 3. Download and review the MOC training PowerPoint
- 4. View all slides to ensure full completion of the training
- 5. Complete and submit the Attestation Form

A Provider Alert will be issued to notify you as soon as the training becomes available.

The HIPAA Minute: Violation Prevention

What is a HIPAA Violation?

 It is an intentional or unintentional disclosure of PHI to an unauthorized individual or entity.

Common HIPAA Violations

- Sending PHI to incorrect health plan, such as authorization requests
- Not sending emails containing PHI securely (encrypted)

Best Practices to Avoid Violations

- Slow down
- Double check
- Fix known issues (update fax or email addresses in systems)
- Training staff on best practices

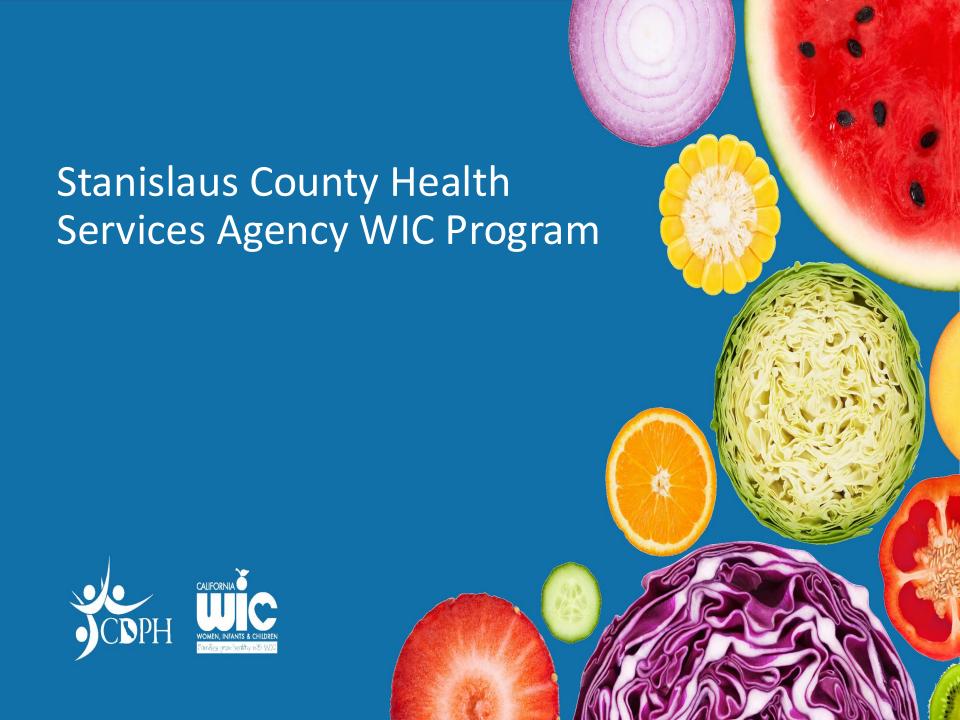

What is WIC?

The Women, Infants & Children Program helps individuals who are pregnant or just had a baby, and children up to the age of 5 eat well, be active, and stay healthy. WIC welcomes partners, grandparents, foster parents, or guardian who care for eligible children. WIC services are provided at no cost to participants. Services are offered remotely.











Who is eligible for WIC?



Women who are:

Pregnant

Breastfeeding a baby under 1 year of age

Postpartum (6 months)



Children:

0-5 years of age including those cared for by a single father, grandparent, foster parent, step-parent, or guardian



Income

Have a family income within Federal WIC Guidelines.

If applicant is receiving Medi-Cal, TANF, or CalFresh they are automatically considered income-eligible.

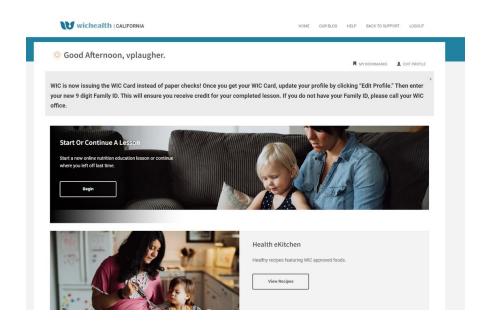

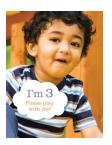

WIC and Biometrics

- To ensure proper growth in relation to nutritional intake the WIC program collects the Height and Weights of participants.
- To ensure proper intake of iron rich foods to assist participants with prenatal, postpartum, and pediatric nutritional education the WIC program collects hemoglobin (HgB) of participants.
- Every participant at WIC receives individualized nutritional education from a WIC Nutrition Assistant under the guidance of a Registered Dietitian and Degreed Nutritionists.

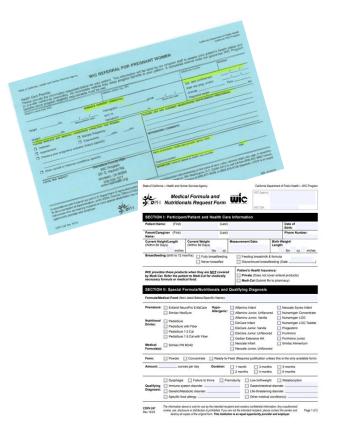

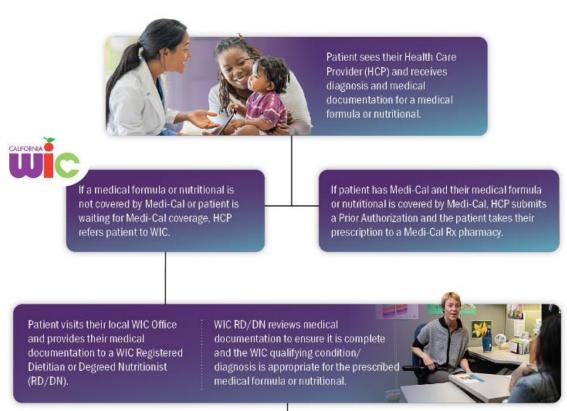

High Risk Infants and Therapeutic Formula

WIC is Interim Coverage-Insurance is the Long Term

- WIC is a temporary solution, not the long term.
- WIC will verify that the criteria on the prescription is met.
 - If the diagnosis does not match the prescription, it will get sent back.
- WIC can only verify that the participant has Medi-Cal with consent.

Pumps

- WIC cannot verify breast pump benefits through other health plans.
- WIC does not have an additional list of pumps available from managed care plans.
- WIC only offers brand of pumps offered through the WIC office.











Resources for Healthcare & Community Services

WIC Mandatory Referrals

■TANF, CalFresh, Medi-Cal, Child Support, Substance Abuse, CHDP, Lead screening, immunizations

WIC participants may have non-nutrition related needs:

- ■Basic (i.e. money, food, housing, transportation, etc.)
- ■Legal/Public Safety
- ■Education/Employment
- ■Family Issues
- Health Care
- Mental Health
